1. How do I register? What is the deadline

3. What is the cost?

There is no cost to participants; the Maternal and Child Health Bureau (cooperative agreement U45MC27709) fund this initiative.

4. How long is the project?

Programming begins October 5, 2021 and ends in June 2022.

This activity is conducted as an online learning collaborative only. Training occurs via live webinars held throughout the nine-month course.
